


B. Field Services

Animal Control Officers (ACOs) respond to calls for service that promote and protect both public health and public safety for the citizens and animals.

Field Services operates on a 7-day, 24-hour call-for-service model based on the level of priority assigned to all received calls. Six full-time ACOs, one Animal License Inspector, and one Field Services Supervisor currently serve the city.

ACOs rotate on-call assignments in response to allied agency requests and emergency calls after hours. During normal business hours, Animal Control Officers respond to both routine and high-priority service requests.

• During the month of November, **51 pets** owned by Moreno Valley residents received a free microchip with registration at the Animal Shelter.

Home for the Holidays Adoption Event

41 pets were adopted during this low-cost pet adoption event that ran from November 18th

 22nd. The adoption fees for all pets were waived and included spay-neuter surgery, vaccinations, and a microchip with lifetime registration.

<u>United Activists for Animal Rights \$125k Donation - Update</u>

 149 pets owned by Moreno Valley residents have received low-income spay/neuter vouchers since February and 123 vouchers have been redeemed. These residents must meet Riverside County HUD income guidelines and own medium to large dogs as outlined in the donation award letter.
