| 1. CAP - COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE - FOOD PROGRAM - (951) 485-7792 | Provides emergency and supplemental food and referrals to families and individuals in need. Also provides clothing and utility payment assistance when available. | \$29,070 |
| 2. GOD’S HELPING HAND - FOOD PROGRAM - (951) 653-2529 | Provides emergency and supplemental food, clothing, and referrals to families and individuals in need. | \$8,550 |
| 3. SALVATION ARMY - FOOD PROGRAM - (951) 653-9131 | Provides emergency food to persons in need. | \$5,000 |
| 4. P.W. ENHANCEMENT CENTER - EMERGENCY SERVICES - (951) 242-7001 | Provides emergency outreach services to persons in need, including motel vouchers and shelter placement assistance for homeless persons, rental assistance, food distribution, job search assistance and referrals. | \$14,250 |
| 5. LUTHERAN SOCIAL SERVICES - TRANSITIONAL LIVING PROGRAM - (951) 656-6020 | A transitional program for homeless women and children that provides long term housing, case management, life skills training, counseling, and other services to promote self sufficiency and independent living. | \$14,250 |
| 6. PATH OF LIFE MINISTRIES - KING HALL HOMELESS SHELTER – (951) 697-4195 | A transitional program for homeless individuals and families that provides long term housing, case management, life skills training, counseling, and other services to promote independent living. | \$14,250 |
| 7. OPERATION SAFEHOUSE - SHELTER FOR RUNAWAYS - (951) 351-4418 | Provides shelter, food, clothing, counseling, education and support services for runaway/throwaway children ages 11-17 in a safe and supervised environment. | \$7,600 |
| 8. CASA FOR RIVERSIDE COUNTY - FOSTER YOUTH SERVICES - (760) 346-2497 | CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates Program) provides court appointed volunteers to monitor and advocate on behalf of children in the legal and foster care systems. | \$9,500 |
| 9. CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION PROGRAM - (951) 686-7273 | The Riverside Area Rape Crisis Center provides abuse prevention and education programs to children and adults through the Moreno Valley schools. | \$7,125 |
| 10. ASSISTANCE LEAGUE OF RIVERSIDE - YOUTH SERVICES - (951) 682-3445 | The Operation School Bell program provides new “back to school” clothing, shoes, backpacks, hygiene kits and books to school aged children in need. | \$9,500 |
| 11. YOUTH OPPORTUNITY CENTER (YOC) - YOUTH SERVICES - (951) 657-7105 | The Center will offer local youth access to an array of educational services (tutoring and college preparation), job coaching and placement, support groups, and volunteer/civic engagement coordination. | \$25,000 |
| 12. FAMILY SERVICE ASSOCIATION - MEAL PROGRAM FACILITY - (951) 686-1096 | Funding will assist with the establishment of a kitchen facility where meals will be prepared for the low income children enrolled and run by Family Service Association daycare centers. | \$25,000 |
| 13. FRIENDS OF THE SENIOR CENTER - SENIOR VAN PROGRAM - (951) 358-9202 | The “MoVan” is a specially equipped 17-passenger van designed to transport the elderly and adult handicapped to medical and other appointments within a 30 mile radius, at low or no cost. | \$28,500 |
| 14. ARC OF RIVERSIDE - DISABLED ADULT DAY CARE FACILITY - (951) 247-6077 | Provides life skills training, opportunities to access the community, and crucial health services to individuals with developmental disabilities. | \$5,000 |
| 15. ALTERNATIVES TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE (ADV) - (951) 320-1370 | ADV provides comprehensive domestic violence support services including shelter, 24-hour crisis line, counseling, and referrals to battered women and their children. | \$7,125 |
| 16. VOLUNTEER CENTER ‘211’ - TELEPHONE REFERRAL PROGRAM - (800) 464-1123 or 211 | Provides 24 hour, 7 days a week information and referral services for residents needing social services. | \$5,000 |
| 17. FORECLOSURE COUNSELING SERVICES - FAIR HOUSING COUNCIL - (951) 653-8314 | The Fair Housing Council of Riverside County provides foreclosure prevention assistance to homeowners through case management, counseling & education, and lender mediation. Services are free of charge. | \$21,079 |

18. FORECLOSURE PREVENTION WORKSHOPS - (951) 413-3450	\$28,500
The City of Moreno Valley will offer a series of free foreclosure prevention workshops to provide distressed homeowners with information and resources to assist them in retaining their homes.	
19. FAIR HOUSING DISCRIMINATION SERVICES - (951) 653-8314	\$30,000
Provides education, enforcement and investigation of fair housing discrimination complaints.	
20. LANDLORD-TENANT MEDIATION SERVICES - (951) 653-8314	\$14,250
Provides dispute resolution and mediation services for both tenants and landlords in dealing with rental issues.	
21. DRACAEA STREET SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENT PROJECT - (951) 413-3150	\$650,000
The project will design and construct sidewalks, while widening Dracaea Street, from Perris Boulevard to Patricia Street.	
22. HABITAT FOR HUMANITY - 'HELPING HANDS' MOBILE HOME PROGRAM - (951) 787-6754	\$10,000
Designed to help low and fixed income households in mobile home communities make necessary exterior improvements to their dwellings in order to avoid penalties that could lead to eviction.	
23. NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UP PROGRAM - (951) 413-3450	\$14,250
City of Moreno Valley provides for large-scale neighborhood clean-ups (utilizing commercial dumpsters and skip loaders) providing haul away services to residents within the CDBG target area neighborhoods.	
24. NEIGHBORHOOD CODE ENFORCEMENT/FORECLOSURE PROGRAM - (951) 413-3340	\$285,208
City Code Compliance staff will provide proactive enforcement of property maintenance codes and to identify and address the proliferation of unmaintained vacant and foreclosed homes within the CDBG Target Areas.	
25. SMALL BUSINESS COUNSELING SERVICE - (951) 781-2345	\$50,000
Provides technical assistance, training, and seminars for Moreno Valley small businesses on topics such as financial planning, marketing, taxes, creating a business plan and business expansion.	
26. MV NEW BUSINESS INCENTIVE PROGRAM - (951) 413-3460	\$195,616
Incentive to attract reputable retailers to vacant retail spaces and commercial centers through the use of loans, grants or interest subsidies in exchange for the creation of jobs for low and moderate income persons.	
27. COMMUNITY EMPLOYMENT RESOURCE CENTER - (951) 413-3920	\$145,000
The City of Moreno Valley provides computers, internet access, resume preparation, employment search assistance, and unemployment benefit application services free of charge to job seekers and the unemployed.	
28. PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION - (951) 413-3450	\$293,733
The City of Moreno Valley administers the CDBG Program, project development, environmental reviews, reporting, special studies, program contracts and monitoring.

1. HOME IMPROVEMENT LOAN PROGRAM - (951) 413-3450	\$250,000
City of Moreno Valley offers low interest (3%) deferred loans for income qualified homeowners to rehabilitate single family homes.	
2. MOBILE HOME GRANT PROGRAM - (951) 413-3450	\$100,000
City of Moreno Valley offers a grant up to \$10,000 to income qualified owner-occupants of mobile homes to eliminate substandard conditions. Participants must rent space within a Moreno Valley mobile home park.	
3. HEACOCK FAMILY APARTMENTS - (951) 413-3450	\$1,000,000
Funding for the construction of a 77 unit multi-family affordable housing project.	
4. CHDO (COMMUNITY HOUSING DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION) HOUSING - (951) 413-3450	\$88,242
City of Moreno Valley funds rehabilitation and/or construction of a multi-family affordable housing project for low income residents. Project to be developed by a Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO).	
5. HOME PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION - (951) 413-3450	\$58,828
The City of Moreno Valley administers the HOME Program, project development, environmental reviews, reporting, special studies, program contracts and monitoring.
