| 1. | CITY OF MORENO VALLEY - PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION – (951) 413-3450
The City of Moreno Valley manages the overall CDBG grant program and reports to the Office of Housing and Urban Development on program outcomes. This includes project selection, overseeing of sub recipients, environmental reviews, special studies, program reporting and monitoring of all awards. | \$420,059 |
| 2. | ASSISTANCE LEAGUE OF RIVERSIDE- OPERATION SCHOOL BELL- (951) 684-1703
Operation School Bell is a program provided to elementary, middle school and high school students with a goal of assisting them in removing barriers to learning. Since 1967 they have provided new school clothes, backpacks, school supplies, hygiene kits and ready books to homeless and economically disadvantaged children. | \$10,000 |
| 3. | FAIR HOUSING COUNCIL- FH ANTI-DISCRIMINATION SERVICES/LANDLORD TENANT COUNSELING (951) 653-8314
Provides comprehensive services which affirmatively address and promote fair housing/anti-discrimination rights and further other housing opportunities for all. This is accomplished through three component areas including education, training/technical assistance and enforcement. | \$51,125 |
| 4. | FAMILY SERVICE ASSOCIATION (FSA) – SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAM – (951) 342-3057
Provides case management for the Senior Nutrition Program which provides hot meals in a group setting at the Moreno Valley Senior Center and delivers to homebound seniors/elderly to help with basic nutritional needs and well-being. | \$10,000 |
| 5. | FRIENDS OF MORENO VALLEY SENIOR CENTER – MO-VAN SENIOR TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM – (833) 745-8454
The “Mo-Van” offers transportation services to the elderly and disabled to medical and other appointments at low cost. | \$41,000 |
| 6. | GRID ALTERNATIVES – LOW INCOME SOLAR ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM- (951) 471-7045
Provides installation of solar electric systems to low income families, and installs them using a model that gives volunteers and job trainees hands-on solar installation experience at no-cost. | \$50,000 |
| 7. | HABITAT FOR HUMANITY –A BRUSH WITH KINDNESS - (951) 787-6754
Designed to help low and moderate income households in mobile home communities to make necessary exterior improvements to their dwellings in order to avoid penalties that could lead to eviction. | \$10,000 |
| 8. | OPERATION SAFE HOUSE – EMERGENCY SHELTER FOR YOUTH – (951) 351-4418
Provides shelter/safe house, 24 hour supervision, life skills classes, educational tutoring, meal preparation, 1-800 crisis line assistance, and transportation, for homeless and runaway youth ages 17-24. | \$10,000 |
| 9. | RIVERSIDE AREA RAPE CRISIS CENTER – CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION PROGRAM –(951) 686-7273
Provides primary prevention education for Moreno Valley schools, grades K-12, including Special Education and bilingual classrooms. The program educates students, parents and teachers on facts of physical, verbal, sexual abuse and neglect. | \$10,000 |
| 10. | SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER (University Enterprises Corp) – IE SMALL BUSINESS DEV. - (951) 781-2345
Provides business consulting and training services to existing and start-up business enterprises within the City of Moreno Valley. Topics include: start-up, QuickBooks, marketing, time management, operations, HR, financing, business plan development, marketing strategy and social media utilization. | \$49,246 |
| 11. | THE SALVATION ARMY – FOOD PANTRY PROGRAM - (951) 653-9131
Provides a food pantry to help individuals and their families in need. Families may access the pantry once every 30 days. | \$10,000 |
| 12. | THE SALVATION ARMY- NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UP PROGRAM- (951) 653-9131
Provides clean up services throughout the City of Moreno Valley. Employees will be transported and supervised by the Salvation Army. | \$30,000 |
| 13. | VOICES FOR CHILDREN – COURT APPOINTED SPECIALADVOCATE (CASA) PROGRAM – (951) 472-9301
Provides recruitment, training, and supervision of CASA volunteers who serve as advocates for foster children. | \$25,000 |
| 14. | CITY OF MORENO VALLEY- MORENO VALLEY EMPLOYMENT RESOURCE CENTER (ERC) –(951) 413-3920
The Moreno Valley ERC provides computers, internet access, resume preparation, employment search assistance, and unemployment benefit application services free of charge to job seekers and the unemployed. | \$66,000 |

| 15. | MORENO VALLEY POLICE DEPT – COMMUNITY BETTERMENT –POP BASED POLICING & HOLIDAY CHEER – (951) 486-6700
Designed to bring law enforcement to a personal community level in order to solve neighborhood problems. Funding will go towards members of the Problem Oriented Policing (POP) team to work within the CDBG designated area. | \$81,919 |
| 16. | CITY OF MORENO VALLEY – CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT PAVEMENT REHAB – (951) 413-3130
This project will provide pavement rehabilitation to various streets in the City Low/Mod Census Tract areas including reconstruction of access ramps to meet current ADA requirements. | \$825,944 |
| 17. | CITY OF MORENO VALLEY –ADA IMPROVEMENTS AT CITY FACILITIES – (951) 413-3740
This project consists of improvements to various City Facilities including corrective actions to meet ADA requirements such as restroom upgrades, re-stripping of accessible parking spaces, installation of ADA accessible path of travel, reach ranges and door pressures. | \$400,000 |
| 18. | CITY OF MORENO VALLEY – MAIN LIBRARY ADA IMPROVEMENTS – (951) 413-3740
The project involves, adjustments to door closer pressure, and/or installation of automatic openers, installation of curb ramps, correction of parking lot slopes & warning strips, exterior sidewalks, patios and warning strips, and adjustments to restroom height and distance of sinks, toilets, & counters. | \$300,000¹ |
| 19. | CITY OF MORENO VALLEY – CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT ALESSANDRO/GRANT ST. TRAFFIC SIGNAL– (951) 413-3149
This project consists of the construction of a new traffic signal and related street improvements for the intersection located at Alessandro Blvd. and Grant St. within the CDBG Target Area. | \$280,000¹ |

| 1. | HOME PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION – (951) 413-3450
The City of Moreno Valley manages the overall HOME grant program including project selection, overseeing of sub recipients, environmental reviews, special studies, all program reporting and monitoring. | \$74,439 |
| 2. | CHDO (COMMUNITY HOUSING DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION) HOUSING – (951) 413-3450
Each year HUD requires that 15% of the annual allocation be reserved for affordable housing projects to be developed by a Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO). | \$111,659 |
| 3. | HABITAT FOR HUMANITY – MOBILE HOME REPAIR PROGRAM – (951) 787-6754
This program provides a grant of up to \$10,000 to income qualified owner-occupants of mobile homes to make necessary repairs both interior and exterior. Repairs will first address correction of code, health and safety violations. | \$120,000 |
| 4. | HABITAT FOR HUMANITY – A BRUSH WITH KINDNESS SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENCE – (951) 787-6754
This program provides exterior minor repair services for single family residence homeowners in need. Home preservation services include painting, landscaping, and other exterior minor repairs. | \$150,000¹ |
| 5. | HABITAT FOR HUMANITY – CRITICAL HOME REPAIRS PROGRAM – (951) 787-6754
This program provides grants of up to \$15,000 to income qualified homeowners for both interior and exterior repairs. Repairs will first address correction of code, health and safety violations. | \$300,000¹ |

| 1. | ESG PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION – (951) 413-3450
The City of Moreno Valley manages the overall ESG grant program including project selection, overseeing of sub recipients, environmental reviews, special studies, all program reporting and monitoring. | \$13,104 |
| 2. | CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF SAN BERNARDINO & RIVERSIDE-CASEWORK SERVICES PROGRAM – (909) 388-1239
Provides case management services to homeless and those at risk of homelessness, including community outreach, homeless prevention services, motel vouchers, rental assistance (rent in arrears to prevent eviction), utility assistance, food and other supportive services. | \$68,690² |
| 3. | COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE- HOMELESS MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM (HMIS) –(951) 358-5636
City contribution to support the ESG client tracking software required by HUD for grant data collection and reporting. | \$5,000 |
| 4. | THE SALVATION ARMY- STREET OUTREACH PROGRAM- (951) 653-9131
This program will provide engagement and case management services to homeless individuals including crisis counseling, meals, referrals to emergency shelters, transitional housing and other housing programs. | \$80,000 |
| 5. | U.S. VETERANS INITIATIVE – EMERGENCY SHELTER PROGRAM – (951) 999-9120
This program will provide 8-bed capacity program, a case manager and outreach/housing specialist to connect participants with employment, permanent housing, mainstream benefits, and supportive services. | \$50,670 |
