VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS:

Citizen Patrol (CP) Trained neighborhood patrol units consisting of citizen volunteers. They are a deterrent to crime by being highly visible while patrolling shopping centers, neighborhoods, or targeted problem areas.

Anti-Graffiti Patrol (AGP) Trained citizen volunteers to assist in surveillance, reporting, and apprehension of graffiti vandals.

Station Volunteer Assist various entities at the police station. They help with filing, tracking of offenders, and putting together special events. Assist with Neighborhood Watch presentations, work with special-interest and business groups, assist with data entry and fingerprinting.

Call-Out Program Assist sworn officers involved in major incidents throughout the city. Respond to major traffic accidents and road hazards while operating a patrol car and/or Mobile Command Center (MCC).

Explorer Program A program for the youth of Moreno Valley. Applicants must be between the ages of 14 ½ years and 21 years of age. The Explorer Program teaches responsibility, leadership skills, and discipline. The Explorers are active in various community functions and assist different units of the MVPD.

Chaplain Program For active pastors, priests, rabbis, and other clergy who make themselves available on Ride-Alongs with patrol officers, comfort and provide guidance to victims of crime and/or family who have suffered a traumatic loss.

Reserve Officer For those who have an interest in police work. There are three levels of Reserve Officers for various assignments.

Mounted Posse Search and rescue, high visibility patrol, and working sponsored events with the Moreno Valley Police Department.
