**2009 - MAXIMUM HOME RENTS BY UNIT SIZE AND INCOME LIMIT RESTRICTIONS  
EFFECTIVE APRIL 2009**

HOME has two different requirements when determining the maximum allowable HOME rents as follows:

**1) MAXIMUM RENTS IF UTILITIES ARE PAID BY THE PROPERTY OWNER:** If the property owner pays the utilities, the maximum allowable HOME rents (including the owner paid utilities) may not exceed the amount indicated in the Table below for the appropriate number of bedrooms; or

**2) MAXIMUM RENTS IF UTILITIES ARE PAID BY THE TENANT(S):** If the some or all of the utilities are paid by the tenant(s), the maximum allowable HOME rents indicated in the Table below must be further reduced by the subtracting any tenant-paid utility amounts as indicated in the "Utility Allowance Schedule."
