2. HABITAT FOR HUMANITY RIVERSIDE - CRITICAL HOME REPAIR PROGRAM - (951) 787-6754

\$415,000

The Critical Home Repair program (CHR) is a one-lime home preservation service that offers interior and exterior repairs designed to assist low- and very low-income families living in a single-family home or mobile home secured to the permanent foundation as their primary residence within the City limit of Moreno Valley. The interior repairs consist of electrical, plumbing, flooring, wall repairs, kitchen repairs, termite work, air conditioning, insulation, bath repairs, heating and furnaces, ceiling, and minor repairs. The exterior maintenance includes replacement or repairs of roofing, house trims, siding, awnings, steps, entrance, door, windows, porch deck, handicap access ramps, weatherization, tree removal, and any other maintenance to ensure health, safety and code enforcement compliance.
